* Part of the 'establishment': I've been active on the national church scene in Britain, and internationally, for most of my adult life.



Dr Nick Adams



Connecting with and seeking to understand the spiritual dimension of life matters to me at all sorts of levels. Alongside this I was doing a variety of projects linked with my local parish and broader church work. All this really got me really thinking about where people are at – and not at – in terms of spirituality, faith, Christian commitment and church involvement. I was increasingly challenged by the gap between most people and the shrinking church culture / groups and, have spent the last six years (since 2000), operating 'freelance', committed to exploring, developing and promoting ways to better bridge it.



The Rt Revd Dr Graham Kings




