> Synopsis

Sister Act is about Dolores, a Reno lounge singer who witnesses her mobster boyfriend killing an employer. She is then hidden in a convent under a witness protection program. Although she is convinced she will hate the religious life and that it will stop her doing all the things she is used to doing, she soon makes friends with the nuns especially Sister Mary Robert, Sister Mary Lazarus and Sister Mary Patrick. After the Mother Superior catches her going out to a bar in the night time followed by Sister Mary Robert and Sister Mary Patrick she orders her to join the most boring thing she can think of: the church choir. But 'Sister' Mary Clarence does have one talent; she knows about music and how to sing. Once she takes over teaching the choir she revolutionises the music. The choir proves to be a big success with the people in the surrounding neighbourhood, and soon the church is full, but her boyfriend is still out there looking for her and it is only a matter of time...

- > About the Salve Regina

The Salve Regina is a prayer to the Virgin Mary. It is one of the Marian anthems in the Roman Catholic church and and is the final prayer of the Rosary.

It is a medieval prayer, originally written in Latin as: Salve, Regina, Mater misericordiae, vita, dulcedo, et spes nostra, salve.
Ad te clamamus, exsules filii Evae, ad te suspiramus, gementes et flentes in hac lacrimarum valle.
Eia, ergo, advocata nostra, illos tuos misericordes oculos ad nos converte; et Iesum, benedictum fructum ventris tui, nobis post hoc exilium ostende.
O clemens, O pia, O dulcis Virgo Maria.

In English it is usually rendered as:

Hail, holy Queen, Mother of Mercy, our life, our sweetness and our hope.
To you do we cry, poor banished children of Eve; to you do we send up our sighs, mourning and weeping in this valley of tears.

Turn then, most gracious advocate, your eyes of mercy toward us; and after this our exile, show to us the blessed fruit of your womb, Jesus. O clement, O loving, O sweet Virgin Mary.
